## PILGRIM'S WELCOME FOR 2019 WORLD YOUTH DAY TRIP

The next World Youth Day, an international event held every 2-3 years for Catholic young people, will be hosted by Panama in January of 2019. World Youth Day was initiated by Pope John Paul II in 1986, and is a weeklong multicultural celebration of our Catholic faith through music, prayer, art, theater, liturgy and pilgrimage... culminating with a massive outdoor Mass celebrated by Pope Francis.

The Augustinian Youth Encounter is a similar gathering but on a smaller scale, where young people have the opportunity to journey with others connected to the Augustinians from around the world. Together they explore how the charism of the Order is being lived out in their local schools, parishes, and youth groups, and they have an experience of mission together.

This January, St. Augustine High School is offering a pilgrimage to the Augustinian Youth Encounter and World Youth Day as an Intersession course open to current sophomores, juniors and seniors.

We will spend the first week of Intersession in the classroom preparing for our pilgrimage. We will depart for San Jose, Costa Rica on January 12; travel to David, Panama for the Augustinian Youth Encounter on January 14; continue on to Panama City for World Youth Day on January 21; and return to San Diego on January 29. We will be using Tijuana International Airport via the Cross Border Express terminal on the San Diego side of the border. The Campus Ministry team will accompany the group.

This will be the fourth consecutive World Youth Day pilgrimage sponsored by Saints. We anticipate bringing approximately 40 students. The cost is \$1400 and includes everything except lunches on travel days. Spaces will be allotted on a first come, first served basis.

## Who is St. Katharine Drexel?

Saint Katharine Drexel, Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament, (November 26, 1858 – March 3, 1955) was an American heiress, philanthropist, religious sister, educator, and foundress. She was canonized by the Roman Catholic Church in 2000; her feast day is observed on March 3. She was the second canonized saint to have been born in the United States and the first to have been born a U.S. citizen.



## **SALUTATORIAN ADDRESS 2018**

ood morning. As we close our Baccalaureate Mass I would like to welcome to our families, friends, teachers, faculty, Augustinian friars, members of the Class of 1968, and of course my fellow graduating Saintsmen to our graduation ceremony. Throughout these past four years my Saints brothers and I have been answering questions. Not everyone was asked the same questions, but one confronted all of us the first second we walked on campus. What are we going to do here? Upon reflection.

see we have answered this question like a good old math challenge problem; with many unique solutions but only one final answer. Here is one example of that answer. Several years ago a young girl named Kimi was diagnosed with life-threatening cancer. Being only 9 years old Kimi had much she still wished to do, but above all she wanted to learn to play guitar. Well one Saintsman of our class heard her wish, and volunteered his time and talents to teach her. He spent months with her explaining how to tune, read sheet music, and play with a pick. Even after she learned though, he pondered how he could more completely fulfill her dream. After much thought and planning, he organized a concert for Kimi to play live in front of an audience. This show was attended, in substantial numbers, by other Saintsmen coming out to support her. And the music, strummed to the tune of "Yellow Submarine," was breath-taking. Stories like this are perfect examples of how the conviction to turn thought into action is at the heart of our Saints' spirit. Action, guided by our faith and Augustinian values of Unitas, Veritas, and Caritas, was our answer.

Community, our first core value, was one of our class' most remarkable achievements. We put the effort into creating that rare, enriching community that is fully welcoming, fully involved, and without social barriers.

A simple walk through campus would reveal plenty of evidence. You would see a room full of clay-caked seniors teaching each other to craft elephant-shaped teapots. You would see us practicing the trombone together and operating DJ stations. You would see lunch food experiments and once a year, jousting. We also fostered our bond through a healthy competitive spirit, as shown by our successes in academic competitions like Science Olympiad, debates like Mock Trial, and nearly continuous sporting events. Passions have never been higher than in intramural dodgeball. Together we led the Pit to be louder, prouder, and more colorful than ever. Our cheers and chants made history as they shook the walls of the new Rev. Sanders Gym for its first basketball season. Most importantly though, we collectively

grew in our faith. Celebrating weekly Mass gave us time to slow down and reflect on the most important piece of our lives. By sharing in the sacraments together too we received God's grace as a community. These experiences are what have made us a lasting family.

Furthermore, as Saintsmen we relentlessly pursued the truth. We first found truth by enhancing our intellectual horizons. For us, that went beyond what was laid out in the planner, because we actively sought out more learning. When the AP Physics C course was discontinued for a year, members of this class revived it. We also raced homemade robots, made small dogs with a 3D printer, and learned Mandarin. We pursued truth across borders, sending Saintsmen to live in Panama, intern in Waterford, and visit the Holy See in Rome. In these places and at home within our cultural clubs we explored different viewpoints and became worldly. The most valuable truths we learned however, were God's truths. A religious education engaged us in meaningful conversations of ethics, morals, and our calling as Christians. Annual retreats like KAIROS gave us unparalleled opportunities to explore our beliefs and learn about each other in confidential, highly personal settings.

Finally, we spent four years exercising our endless capacity to love, and a love for God and His children is nowhere more apparent than at Saints. We shared our love with the poor and vulnerable by feeding the homeless at St. Vincent's de Paul's and visiting the Hogar Infantil orphanage. We donated our food, toys, and blood to the collections we organized. Our love for each other and those in need built up clubs like Fifa for the Orphans and Key Club.

The small and big kindnesses we did for each other every day, such as tutoring, welcoming everyone to soccer games on the field, or just listening in times of need, are the proof that Caritas permeates the air at Saints.

I could go on about how we made our Saints experience, but I could never finish.

So from all this, it is easy to see that when confronted with the question of what we would do at Saints, this class readily gave its answer, saying "We will become experts at doing good work. Amazing, inspiring, helpful, Catholic stuff." And we have fulfilled that promise, and there is no doubt that we will continue turning thought into loving, widespread, and impactful action.

Our coming achievements will only be more spectacular and more life-changing. I am entirely confident that God's Earth is going to look much, much better in the future because of the Saints Class of 2018. Thank you, and congratulations to the Class of 2018.





I graduated from Santa Clara University and for the past 42 years I've served as Saints Director of Finance & Facilities. Our weight training facility, if you'd call it that, was outside at a corner of the football field. Equipment consisted of concrete filled coffee cans attached to either end of a metal bar. Not much to brag about, I know, but our football team did play for the CIF championship that year.

Of course now we have Villanova and Mendel Halls, The St. Augustine Commons, and we'll soon be moving into our new weight room and the Raymond Center for the Performing Arts.

But what hasn't changed and has remained constant throughout the years is the spirit of brotherhood every Saintsman has experienced. Yes, brick and mortar are essential to a school's physical well being. But it's what goes on inside the walls and on the fields that makes Saints so special.

It's the teachers, coaches, staff, mentors, administrators, the entire student body, and yes our alumni that give a pulse to the heartbeat of our core values of Unity, Truth, and Love. It's this personal interaction that creates that unique bonding and helps define the Saints Experience.

As Alumni Director I attended countless class reunions and for any number of reasons attendance kept getting smaller, and smaller as the years progressed.

There's a saying that no one who comes into this world goes out alive. None of us knows when God will call us to join him.

So before leaving today take this opportunity to acknowledge and thank those people, including your classmates, who have been important to you over the past four years.

Most importantly, be sure to thank your parents. They have been an integral part of your experience at Saints. They gave up their time, invested their money, and probably lost some sleep along the way to make this day become a reality for you. Be sure you show them your love and appreciation.

In closing, the great author Mark Twain said "success is a journey, not a destination." As you move forward on your life's journey some of you will leave San Diego and some will stay. Some of you will one day return to work at Saints as I and so many other graduates have. Some of you will become parents of future Saintsmen: or maybe not.

I hoped one day I'd watch a son of mine go through the Saint's Experience but God had other plans for me and my wife. He blessed us with 2 daughters and 5 granddaughters – and they are the loves of our life.

But no matter where life's road takes you, know that Saints has given you the experiences necessary to succeed in your journey. And along the road always remember this: success is not the key to happiness, happiness is the key to success.

May each of your futures be filled with an abundance of both. Congratulations, Class of 2018. God bless you all.


