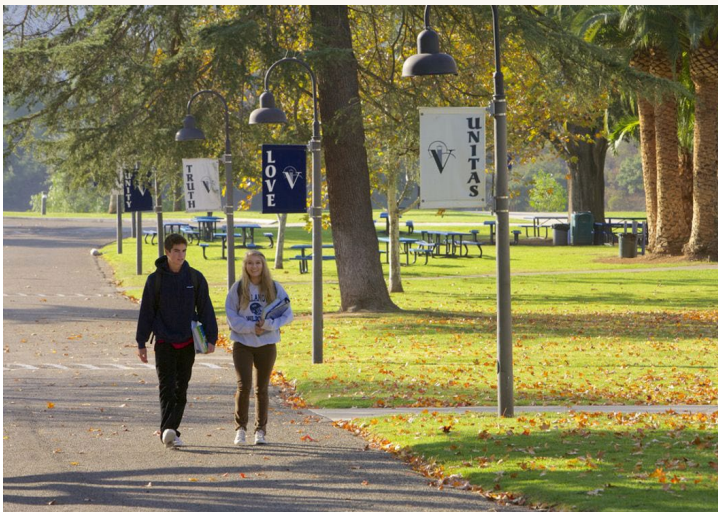
## San Diego Bishop McElroy Named Cardinal

Late last month, Bishop Robert McElroy, who has presided over Mass on campus at St. Augustine High School several times, has been named one of 21 new Cardinals by Pope Francis, according to Very Reverend Gary Sanders, O.S.A. ('67), a member of St. Augustine High's Board of Directors. "I cannot tell you how happy I am that Bishop McElroy has been named a cardinal!" said Fr. ### **Malvern Preparatory School, Malvern, PA (1842)**

Malvern Prep is the direct continuation of the academy program founded in 1842 by the Augustinians as the “preparatory school” for what is now Villanova University. In 1922 the academy program moved from Villanova to 143 acres of land in historic Chester County and became Malvern Prep. Originally a day and boarding school for boys, Malvern Preparatory School is now a day school for some 600 young men.



### **St. Rita of Cascia High School, Chicago, IL (1905)**

Always a high school for boys since its foundation in 1905, in 1990 the school moved from its first historic campus at 63rd and Claremont in South Chicago to the former Quigley Prep campus at 77th and Western. The new campus has a church-sized chapel, swimming pool, gym, ball fields, and excellent teaching facilities which presently serves 900 young men. The school was named by “US News & World Report” as one of the top 25 high schools in the U.S.



### **Providence Catholic High School, New Lenox, IL (1918)**

Originally established in Joliet, Illinois, in 1918, Providence took on a new campus in New Lenox in 1962. The Augustinians direct the 1150 student, coed institution. Unique to Augustinian schools in the U.S., Providence offers a large and excellent early education program for the community. In addition to excellence in studies, Providence has earned 24 state championships in sports.



### **St. Augustine High School, San Diego, CA (1922)**

Located on a little over seven acres of land in urban San Diego (not far from Balboa Park and the San Diego Zoo), Saints is a school for 700 young men from the San Diego-Tijuana region. Over 90% are Catholics. Known as “Saintsmen,” alumni have made significant contributions to the civic and Church communities. A recent building effort has provided all new classroom, library, student services, and library facilities.



### **Villanova Preparatory School, Ojai, CA (1924)**

Villanova Prep is located on 117 acres of land in the beautiful Ojai Valley, 80 miles north of Los Angeles and 30 miles south of Santa Barbara. Founded as a boarding and day school for boys, the school became coeducational in 1971. With 315 students, it provides boarding facilities for about one-third of the students who are from ten different countries.



### **Cascia Hall, Tulsa, OK (1926)**

Founded in 1926 as a school for boys in grades 7 through 12, with boarding as well as day students, Cascia Hall became coeducational in 1986. Its present enrollment is 575 students in grades 6 through 12. The beautiful and well equipped campus has a unique French Norman architectural style, and is located in a residential area of midtown Tulsa.



### **St. Augustine College Preparatory School, Richland, NJ (1959)**

The Prep has grown from its first graduating class of 12 students (1963) to a current enrollment of over 550 young men. It is recognized as the premier college prep school for boys in Southern New Jersey, and recently completed a major building program to provide greater opportunities in the arts and sports.

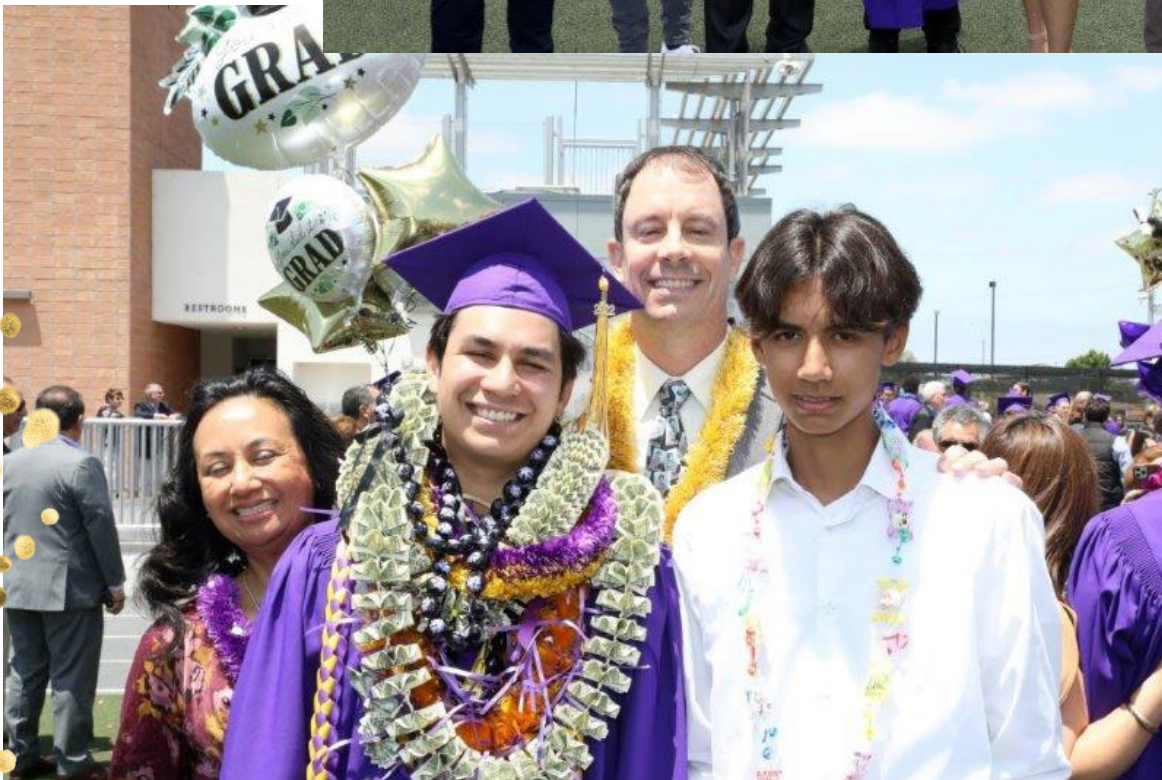

than the rest of the world. His elevation delights me! He is a true friend of the Augustinians and St. Augustine's."

Bishop McElroy, 68, is reportedly one of Pope Francis' ideological allies by various media.

Los Angeles Archbishop José Gomez, president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops who has worked with McElroy for many years, offered congratulations — adding that the new cardinal "will serve the global Church well."



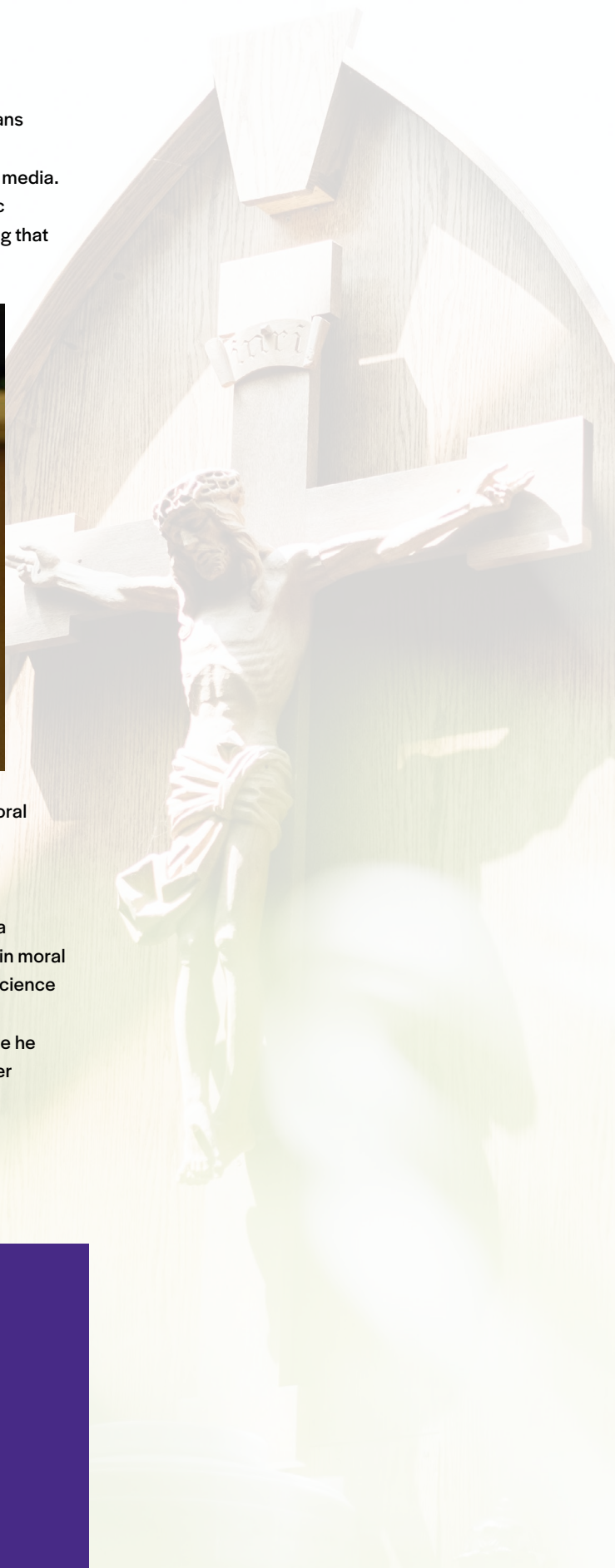
"By naming Bishop Robert McElroy as a cardinal, Pope Francis has shown his pastoral care for the Church in the United States," Gomez said in a written statement.

McElroy received a bachelor's degree in history from Harvard in 1975 and a master's in history from Stanford in 1976.

He studied at St. Patrick Seminary in Menlo Park, California, and in 1985 received a theology degree at the Jesuit School of Theology in Berkeley. He obtained a doctorate in moral theology at the Gregorian University in Rome the following year and a Ph.D in political science at Stanford in 1989.

He was ordained a priest in 1980 and assigned to the San Francisco diocese, where he served in a parish before becoming personal secretary to Archbishop John Quinn. Other California parish assignments included Redwood City and San Mateo.

He became an auxiliary bishop in San Francisco in 2010. In 2015, early in Francis' pontificate, he was named bishop of San Diego.

The school serves a co-ed population of 700 in grades 6-12 and is located in Reading, MA, 15 miles north of Boston.



### Villanova College, King City, Ontario (1999)

Villanova College was founded by lay educators in 1999 and established its campus on 33 acres of land of the Augustinian Marylake Monastery property in 2000. The school embraces Augustinian values and vision. With the completion of their facilities, Villanova College will be able to serve 800 young men and women.

# Coach Davis' Daughter is Now a National Golf Champion

Earlier this spring, Anna Davis, a 16-year-old high-school sophomore from East County San Diego, won the third edition of the Augusta National Women's Amateur.

The slim left hander only until recently has started traveling to junior tournaments by herself or with friends. Her first solo trip was to the AJGA's Heather Farr Classic in Mesa, Arizona – and she won, sparking a run that included eight more finishes of fourth or better in junior events, including a convincing seven-shot romp at the Girls Junior PGA last July that earned her Augusta invitation.

“She’s a good, steady kid who’s very independent, always has been,” said her father, Bill Davis, a teacher/coach at St. Augustine High, “but now she’s found her voice.”

And clearly her game.

And, “I want to be the best in the world,” she said from underneath the brim of a wide bucket hat. Her winning performance at the Augusta National Golf Club proves that she’s on the fast track.

As for the bucket hat, earlier before the Augusta event, her support team which included parents Bill and Beatriz, twin brother Billy and longtime instructor Bill Barrett, had bought earlier that morning in the merchandise building.

Anna has been composed since birth, her dad says, an easy baby who has developed into a mature-beyond-her-years teenager. When Billy, a talented golfer in his own right, decided to attend Saints in San Diego, school, where Bill Davis teaches, Anna opted for online coursework at the local public school so that she could spend more time at the golf course. For that reason she is not a member of the high school golf team.

While the rest of her household departs for the classroom at 6 a.m. daily, Anna, a sophomore, heads to Steele Canyon Golf Club in Jamul, California, where she spends all day practicing, hanging out in the grill room and playing with the adult membership.

“I think I've always felt a little bit older than 16,” Anna said.
